The incidence of cardiac arrests on your train network annually, between 2014-2019. Whether you install Automated External Defibrillators on your trains.

The level of first aid training provided to on-board train staff.

The process by which MerseyRail coordinate on-train medical emergencies.

Response

Thank you for your email.

By way of background, Merseytravel and Merseyrail are separate bodies; Merseytravel is the Executive body that provides professional, strategic and operational transport advice to the Liverpool City Region Combined Authority, while Merseyrail is a 50/50 joint venture company between Serco and Abellio, which has a 25 year concession agreement with Merseytravel to operate the network.

Unfortunately, the requested information is not held by Merseytravel, but I can advise that the information should be held by Merseyrail themselves. As they are a private company, however, they are not subject to the Freedom of Information Act and therefore any information they provide to you would be on a voluntary basis.
